



The Athlete Incentive Awards Scheme was initiated by the HKSI in 1994. Hang Seng Bank has been sponsoring the Scheme for the Olympics, the Paralympics and the National Games since 1996. To date, over HK\$6 million has been awarded to 41 medallists. This year will be the first time that the Scheme has included athletes competing at the East Asian Games.

To recognise their remarkable achievements, an awards presentation ceremony will be held in November, where the cash incentives will be presented to 10<sup>th</sup> National Games and 4<sup>th</sup> East Asian Games medal winners.
